“ Dear Mr. Pous, Joe, Bobby, Jackie, Faye and family,

I was so very sorry to hear of the passing of your wife and mother, of blessed memory, she was a very special lady. Whenever I would see her and Mr. Pous, it was always a pleasure. I know that they felt such sadness at the passing of first my father, Kopel, in 2000 and then my mother in 2006. Our families were quite close for many years. I have very fond memories of when we got together as the men played poker.

On Nov. 26, just after celebrating Thanksgiving, my husband Israel, passed away unexpectedly of a massive heart attack. It still doesn't seem real, he was 59 years old and we were excited to think we would celebrate his 60th birthday in June this year. My children, grandchildren and I are still in a state of shock as it doesn't really seem real, we know it is, but in our hearts it is so very difficult. Trying to celebrate New Year's Eve together was the first holiday we were without him and I don't look forward to my first anniversary this April without him.

I'm sure you are all going through a very difficult time. It doesn't matter what age our parents are or if we expect it. We knew just a short time before my dad died that his illness, Liver Disease was fatal and that he didn't have very long to live. My mother died in her sleep the morning of Israel and my anniversary, April 15th. Her heart just stopped, she had not been sick. It was very peaceful and she didn't suffer. Israel seemed to take her cue as he died after he worked a pretty full day, relaxing in his favorite chair and talking to our youngest daughter on the phone having a great conversation. She lost the phone signal, tried to call him back several times, when he didn't answer, she had a feeling something was wrong, headed to our house and found him unconscious and not breathing. She called 911 and was instructed what to do until the paramedics came. They tried to resuscitate him, but it was too late. It happened so quickly and they said he didn't suffer. It was just five weeks ago on Monday and I feel my life has been turned upside down. The good thing is I have my wonderful daughters, Shanna and Tami, son-in-law Matt, grandchildren, Mackenzie and Aaron, my brother, Serge, my cousins, friends, co-workers. They have all been so supportive.

I hope you all are very close and that you have lots of support to help you through this very difficult time. My thoughts and prayers are with all of you. I hope that 2008 will bring you good health and that your hearts will feel less pain as time goes on and that you will cherish the memories of your beautiful mother. Be well and take care.
